Pride Athletic Club Meeting Minutes, June 2, 2008

President Lee Foreman called the meeting to order at 7:10 pm.

Minutes - Minutes from the May 5, 2008 meeting were read by Charlotte Griffin and approved as amended.

Treasurer's Report – Jay Wooten distributed PAC's financial activities for the calendar year through May 31, 2008. PAC's accounts stand as follows:

Checking Account: \$42,388.55

Money Market: \$55,049.80

CD: \$15,354.21

Total: \$112,792.56

Treasurer's report was approved.

Golf Tournament - In Bill Nolan's absence, Jay gave a report on the golf tournament. PAC netted \$5658.41, double the amount from 2007. There were 92 participants for 120 spots available. Ideas for more participation next year were discussed, including perhaps having the event on a teacher workday to encourage teachers to participate. No decision made.

Concessions - Kim Fitzsimmons reported that PAC took in \$1960 in soccer game concessions. Coach Smothers was able to sell candy, peanuts and Gatorade for the baseball games; however, he had not used the soda. Kim announced that there would be clean up of the concession stand prior to the first football game, August 22nd. She will issue a call for volunteers to help later in the summer. (Jack Rogers announced that the first soccer scrimmage would be August 13th, and homecoming is set for September 26th.) Kim will have the Pepsi truck available by the first of September, but is hoping to have it by the first home football game.

Camps – In Fred Wollman’s absence, Jay reported that 227 campers have registered so far, but 280 to 290 are expected. This amount is below 2007’s attendance.

Bricks – Gayle Steinbugler (in Joan Theret’s absence) reported that the latest order of 20 had arrived and would be installed shortly.

Display Case – Gayle reported that the display case’s framing was complete. Guidance needed on what will be displayed so that a decision can be made on the installation of the shelves and if Plexiglas is supportive enough. The cost of real glass would be an upgrade. Mr. Rogers will work on that.

New Business

Girls Soccer – Lynn Kern requested guidance and funding for a way to commemorate the state soccer championship won by Leesville’s girls. After memory searching and a review of minutes from previous years, it was moved and approved that PAC will purchase hoodies for the members of the girls soccer team. The girls will submit a design and Tracey Foreman is to begin acquiring estimates. Furthermore, it was decided that the PAC has no issue with the girls acquiring a sponsor to purchase championship rings for them.

Marshall Hamilton Scholarship Fund – From the golf tournament funds, April Lyon moved that \$500 be donated to the Marshall Hamilton Scholarship Fund for 2008. Motion approved.

STARS – Janice Schmittle reported that 83.6% of Leesville’s student athletes achieved honor roll status this year. The breakdown is as follows:

579 total students on athletic rosters

330 of the 407 students who played one sport achieved honor roll

98 of the 115 students who played two sports achieved honor roll

56 of the 57 students who played three sports achieved honor roll

Gas – Jack Rogers reported that there is still no decision as to whether schools will be required to pay for gas for their activity buses. It is estimated that it would cost \$12,000 annually.

Athletic Director – Jack Rogers announced that Leesville won the conference’s Wachovia Cup for 2007-2008. The state’s Wachovia Cup points were not announced yet. Kim Kern and Allyson Shiveler were chosen to play in the East-West All-Star game. Expenditure of \$200 for an ad was approved to recognize them.

Two bids for the weight room expansion in the amounts of \$12,877 and \$14,300 have been obtained. One more is needed. Work should take approximately 3 days. It was moved and approved that PAC will contribute \$10,000 to the cost of the weight room expansion.

Bus Fund - Discussion continued about money earmarked for a bus fund. Moved and approved that \$10,000 of the unallocated money in the money market fund be moved to the bus fund, bringing the total to \$40,000.

Loonies Shirts – April Lyon reported that PTSA would like to take over the sale of the Loonie t-shirts. April will talk with PTSA’s sportswear co-chair, Tracey Foreman, to obtain her assurance that PTSA will not realize a profit from the sale of the shirts, as their purpose is strictly for school spirit. Decision on the matter is delayed pending that assurance.

Sponsors – There will be no increase in sponsor fees next year. PAC members will be called upon to help acquire new sponsors, in addition to our current ones, for 2008-2009.

Meeting adjourned at 9:00 pm. Next meeting is July 28th at 7 pm.
