

Graduation Project Requirements & Timeline

Requirements

- Paper – The paper should be eight to ten pages long. Revise/edit/expand the paper you produced in your junior English class, including information you learned as you completed your product. You may seek help with your paper from your junior or senior English teacher or a panel of teachers who will be available on specified dates to provide assistance.
- Product – Evidence of your product should be discussed and displayed during your presentation. There should be documented evidence beyond the artifacts included in your portfolio. This may be a trifold, powerpoint, or other approved format.
- Presentation – Your presentation should be eight to ten minutes long. As stated above, the product should be discussed and displayed during the presentation. The presentation should cover the entire graduation project experience, not only the product. The panel may ask questions after your presentation.
- Portfolio – The portfolio includes documentation of your graduation project experience, including phone/email logs, pictures, forms, and other required elements.

Consult the rubrics in your Graduation Project Handbook as you complete your work.

This will help you to be certain that you are meeting all requirements to pass all parts of the Graduation Project.
